Focus on: Lent and Easter

Reflection and Renewal: A Journey Toward Easter

As we move through the season of Lent, our Wednesday Collective Worship are focussing on the story of Lent and Easter. While many of us are busy counting down the days (and perhaps missing our favorite treats!), Lent offers us a wonderful opportunity to look inward and prepare our hearts for the joy of Easter.

The Power of Forgiveness

This term, our journey is guided by our current school value: Forgiveness. Lent is often seen as a time of "spiritual spring cleaning." Just as we clear out the clutter in our homes, forgiveness allows us to clear out the "clutter" in our hearts—the grudges, the small upsets, and the heavy feelings we sometimes carry.

In our assemblies, we've discussed how forgiveness isn't just about being kind to others; it's a gift we give ourselves.
