I love this wonderful initiative as it provides a great opportunity for our children to make a real difference in the lives of youngsters, who are in real need around the world.

If, as a family, you are able to fill a shoe box, with some of the following items, that would be amazing. If that is not possible, I have asked each class to fill two boxes. So if most youngsters are able to bring one item, from the list below, we would be able to fill two shoe boxes easily.

Here are some suggestions for what to include:

If you are completing a box as a family you can either get a shoe box and wrap it in Christmas paper of I have twenty five shoe boxes, from Samaritan's purse, which I will bring into school on Wednesday 15th October. I will include a leaflet which explains, exactly what you need to do.
