### Dear families,

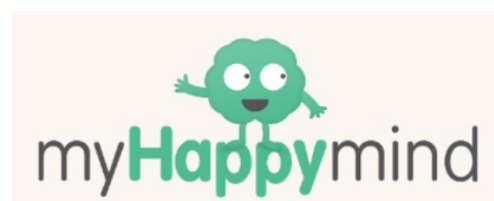

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## Driving and Parking in the lane

Again, we have received complaints about parking problems during drop-off and pick-up times. These have come from both school families and local residents. We need everyone's help to keep our children safe. Our school is on a single-track dead-end lane, which makes it tricky for vehicles to manoeuvre at the best of times. Adding parked cars (or cars that are driving down the lane unnecessarily) to the mix creates a real safety hazard, especially when our school buses are trying to get in and out.

Unless there's a very good reason, such as a disability or a broken leg, we expect everyone to walk down the lane. As a school we can not enforce this however we can ask everyone to be respectful and ensure our children are kept as safe as possible during this busy time.

We understand that it can be tempting to drive closer to the school, especially if you're running late, but the extra congestion makes it dangerous for everyone. Please think of the children's safety first.

It's also important to remember that parking on someone else's property or driveway is never acceptable. It's disrespectful and can cause real inconvenience for residents.

We understand that some parents have busy schedules, but let's work together to make drop-off and pick-up as safe and smooth as possible for everyone. Thank you for your cooperation!
