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School Structure 2025–2026

I'm writing to update you on our class structure for the upcoming academic year. The school will continue the six-class structure that has been in place this year.

This means that our Reception and Key Stage 1 (KS1) classes will continue to be single year groups. Key Stage 2 (KS2) will continue with mixed year group classes.

YR – Acorns
Y1 – Hazel
Y2 – Birch
Y3/4 – Sycamore
Y4/5 – Beech
Y5/6 – Oak

While our overall school size is expected to remain consistent in terms of pupil numbers next year, I anticipate some fluctuations within specific year groups. This means that our Key Stage 2 classes are all projected to have approximately 30 pupils. I understand you'll be keen to know more about your child's learning environment for next year. I am working diligently to finalise class allocations and teacher assignments, and I hope to share your child's class and teacher information with you very soon.
