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Staying Safe Online: A Message for Parents and Children

Next Tuesday is Safer Internet Day and we believe in empowering children to explore the digital world safely and responsibly.

E-safety is a crucial part of our curriculum, teaching children how to navigate the online world with confidence.

We encourage open conversations at home about online safety. Discuss the importance of keeping personal information private, like addresses and passwords. Remind children to be kind and respectful online, just as they are in person. Talk about what to do if they encounter something upsetting or inappropriate – they should tell a trusted adult immediately.

Help your child to understand that not everything they see online is true. Encourage them to question information and ask for your help to verify it. Set clear boundaries for screen time and the websites they can visit. Explore online safety resources together, such as UK Safer Internet Centre (saferinternet.org.uk/). Working together, we can ensure our children enjoy all the benefits the internet offers, while staying safe and secure.
