Focus on: When SHOULD I keep my child off school

Attendance at school is key to academic success.

However there are times when pupils are unwell and should not come into school.

When this occurs it is important that you contact the school first thing in the morning of the first day of absence and then every subsequent day to confirm they are still absent because they are unwell.

Below is a list of illnesses from the NHS that children should be absent from school for and some they don't need to be absent for.

	Until
Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek
